LIVESTOCK RUNNING AT LARGE

8.06.010 Running at Large Prohibited. It shall be unlawful for livestock, horses, cattle, mules, sheep, goats, or swine or any such animals to run at large within the town limits.

8.06.020 Penalty. Any person owning livestock or having in charge any horses, mules, cattle, sheep, goats, or swine, or any such animals, who permits such animals to run at large shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punishable as provided in section 1.08.010 of this Code.

8.06.030 Impoundment. Livestock found running at large shall be seized, impounded, restrained by the Pound master or local law enforcement and held in a pound to be provided by the town and notice shall thereupon be given in writing to the owner of such livestock, giving the number, description, marks and brands of such livestock when impounded, with the reason for impounding the same, together with the amount of charges for impounding and keeping such livestock and that such livestock will, unless the owner thereof redeems the same, be sold and the proceeds of such sale applied to the cost of impounding and keeping such livestock.

8.06.040 Fees. A charge of five dollars (\$5.00) for each animal shall be made to cover the cost of impounding the same in addition thereto, the owner of such animal shall be charged with the cost of keeping and feeding such impounded animal or animals. Such impounded animals shall be kept and restrained until the owner of such impounded animals pay into the City Treasury the fee of five dollars (\$5.00) for each animal impounded and in addition thereto, the cost of keeping and feeding the same. The Town may also terminate impoundment under this section by selling the livestock as provided by this chapter.
